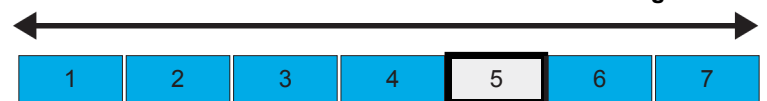

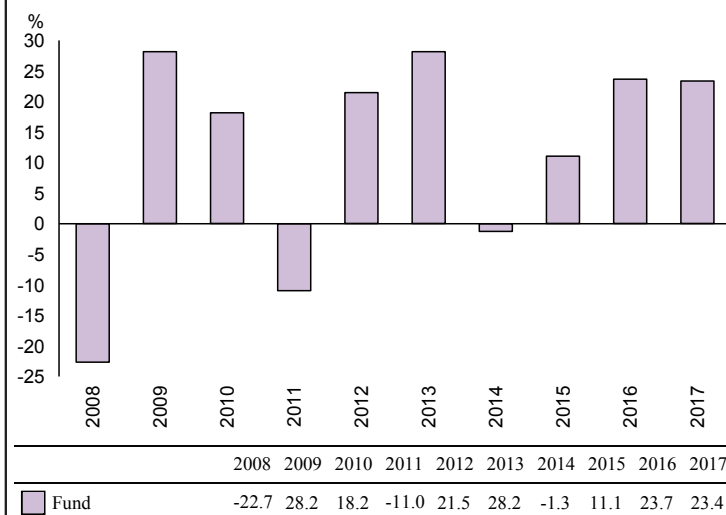

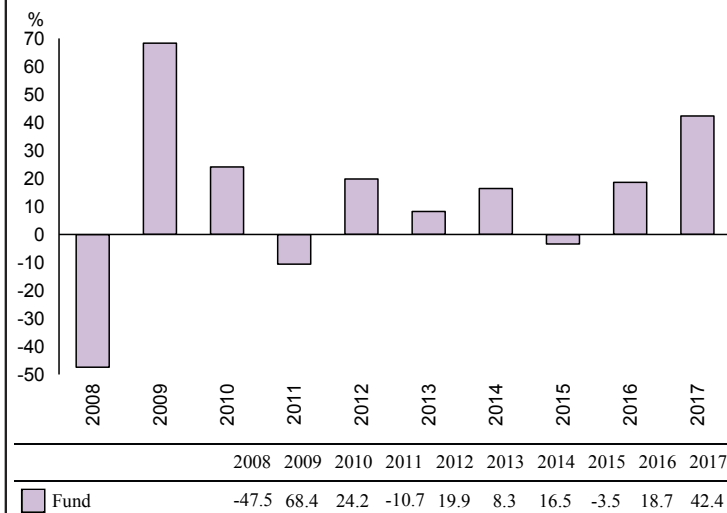

Objectives and Investment Policy

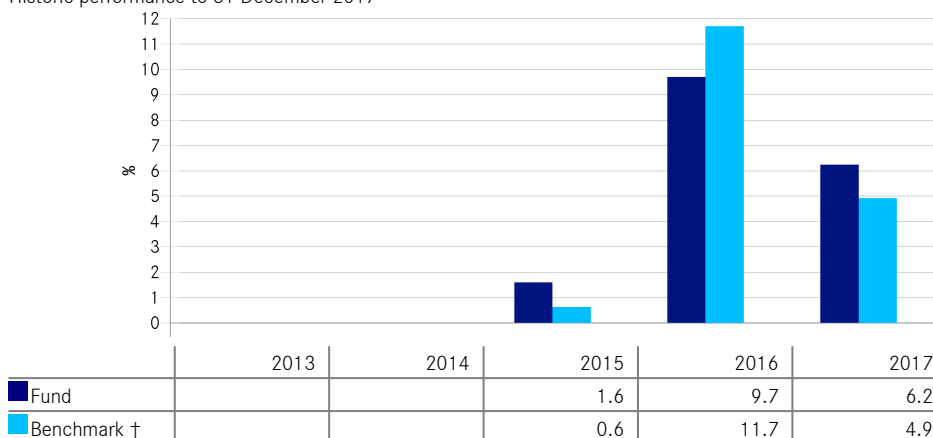

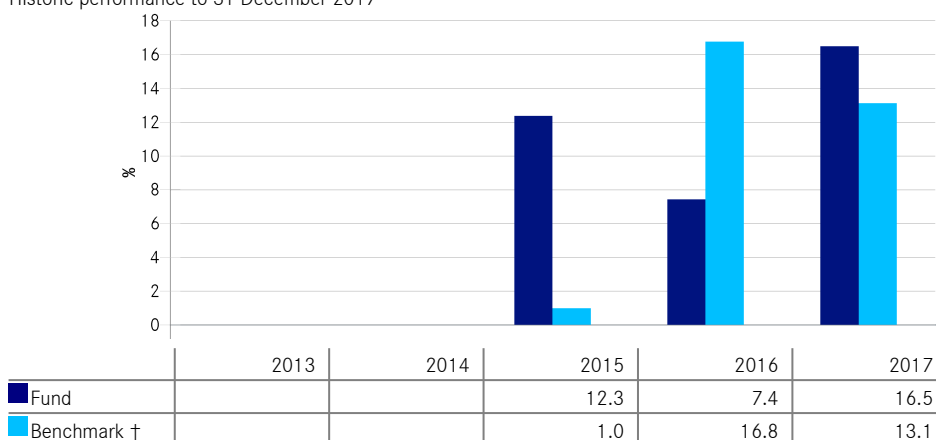

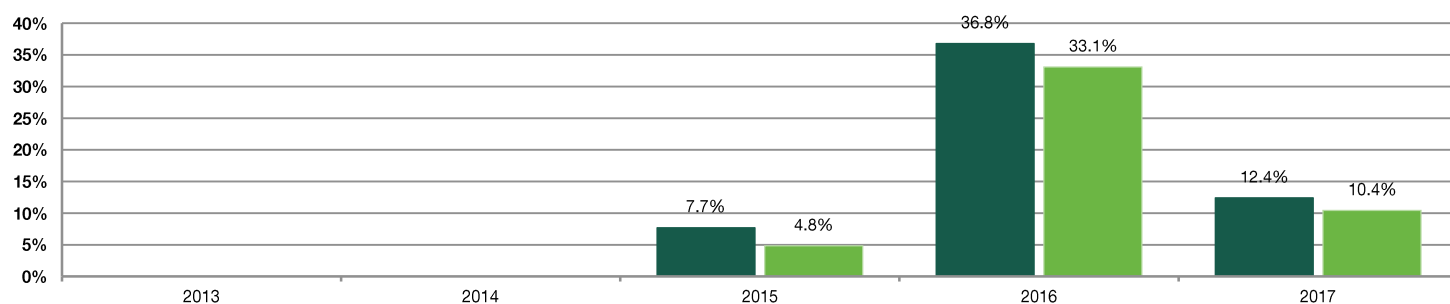

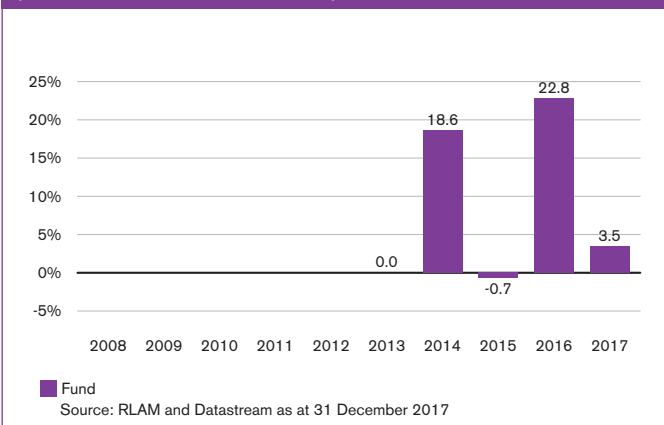

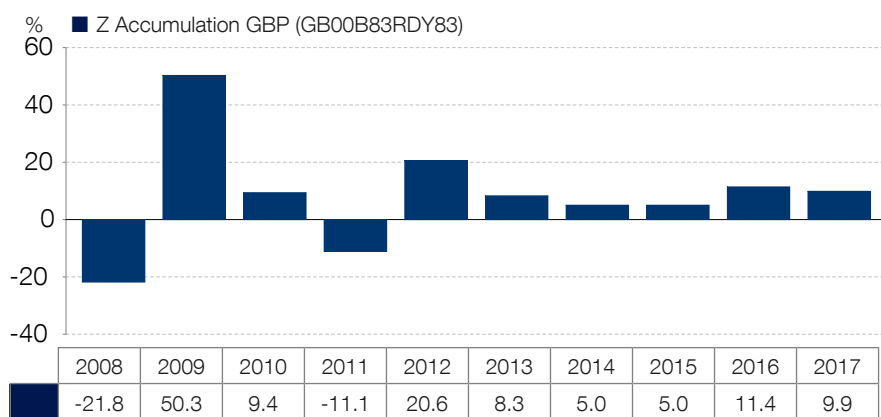
